FROM THE PASTOR

"I can do all things through him who strengthens me." Philippians 4:13

"I can do all things through a verse taken out of context". Meme on Facebook

"We sometimes claim that all Scripture is equally important, equally inspired, or equally clear, but in practice most of us invoke a "canon within the canon" — we consciously or unconsciously privilege some parts of the Bible over others. And that's the way it should be. John 3:16 is more important than Judges 4. Texts of terror remind us that we don't, we can't, and we shouldn't read all Scripture in the same way." Debie Thomas

So, what is your "canon within a canon?" What are the primary verses or principles that help interpret all the others? To be sure, there are some who gravitate towards the violent verses in the Bible to justify their own violence against a certain group of people. That's what Hitler and the nazis did against Jewish people and others who didn't fit into their "master race" mentality. Philippians 4:13 has been used to justify all sorts of things that were never intended by Paul. Certain verses in the Bible were used by those who wanted to keep their lucrative institutions of slavery and racism going. People end up justifying all sorts of things using biblical passages. Whether it's an issue they are clinging to or a desire to keep everything the status quo, everything is seen through that particular lens. It's like the old saying that when you're a hammer, everything looks like a nail. "A religion is more than its texts," Thomas goes on to say. This is true.

Advent is a season of expectant waiting. It is often full of tradition, yet ironically, is also anticipating/expecting something new to enter into our world. Some familiar texts are read, some familiar songs are sung during this season. The familiarity can lull us into a "been-there-done-that" state of mind that is closed to new possibilities. But this Advent I challenge you to read and experience these Scriptures with fresh eyes. What are some questions you have for these texts? Where are these texts challenging your life and where is your life challenging these texts? Is there a new lens, a new perspective you can use to approach the familiar words? It is important to overcome nostalgia.

"Nostalgia" was a diagnosis of "morbid longing to return to one's home or native country, severe homesickness [and was] considered a disease." It is debilitating and prevents us from focusing on the tasks at hand. Nostalgia prevents us from focusing on our mission, on the ministries right in front of us. Pining for the "good old days" can distract us from new ways God might be speaking to us through the Bible and through each other. Figuring out what our tendencies and lenses are helps open our eyes to new possibilities we may not have noticed before.

We might notice glimmers of light in our darkening days that we hadn't seen before. We may see the familiar (which has the same root as "family") in fresh and helpful ways. We may observe how we have been taking certain verses out of their context and making them fit into our world view while ignoring our own biases. The newborn King coming to Bethlehem takes on a whole new meaning with the violence going on in that region of the world and the political callousness in our own country. The great theologian Karl Barth used to say we should have the Bible in one hand and the newspaper in the other hand. I pray that we all can take his advise to heart.

God loves you and so do I, *Pastor Dan*



GUIDELINES FOR GRACE ACTIVITIES IN INCLEMENT WEATHER

In case of threatening weather, especially if National Weather Service has issued a warning:

1. The Congregation Council President will consult with Pastor Dan and available Executive Team to determine with them whether to hold a scheduled worship service;
2. Watch TV (channels WHO 13 & KCCI 8) and listen to local radio stations (KWMT & WOI radio) for information about cancellations.
3. Attend worship or other activity only if you can do so safely.
4. If school is cancelled due to bad weather, Confirmation and Youth Group are also cancelled that evening.

Tricks for an Even Better Candle Season



**Use
Spaghetti
to**

Light a hard-to-reach Pillar

Pasta can do so many things, even light a wick that's sitting deep inside a tall hurricane vase or lantern. Instead of awkwardly trying to wriggle a lighter or match in there (and risking burning yourself!), take an uncooked piece of spaghetti and kindle one end with a lighter. Then use your noodle to get the candle going.

Tin Foil
To**

Fix a Tunneled Candle

If your wax melts only in the center, tunneling through the middle, you're losing valuable burn time! A bit of tin foil can fix this. Before you light your candle, wrap a piece of foil around the jar. Pinch it into a dome shape that covers the ring of unmelted wax but leaves space around the wick. (You don't want the flame to touch the foil.) Next—you guessed it—light the candle. The foil will trap the heat and melt that wall of wax to even out the surface of your candle.

Salt
to**

Extend Burn Time

You know that pricey, amazing-smelling candle you save for special occasions? There is a way to make it last longer. Next time, after you blow out the flame, sprinkle a pinch of table salt into the pool of wax (avoid the wick). Mix the salt into the liquid with a toothpick, then let the wax harden as normal. This can slow down the rate at which your wax melts, resulting in a slightly longer burn time.

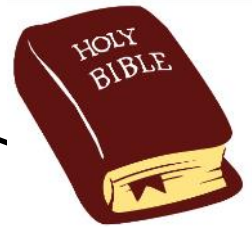

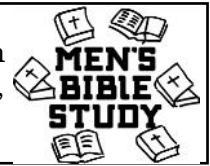


SUNDAY SCHOOL

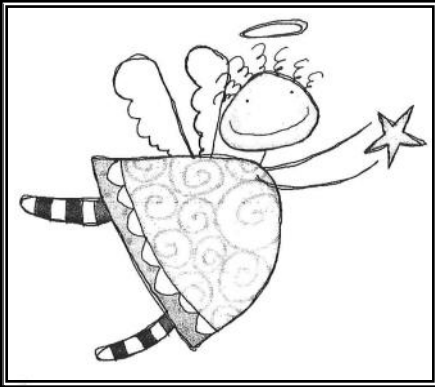

We are looking forward to **St. Lucia Fest.** We will celebrate on December 10, following the church service. Please sign up to bring Scandinavian and other goodies to share.

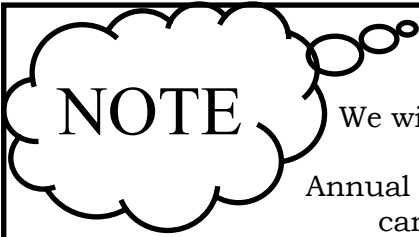
Circles will not meet in December. We will resume meeting in January.

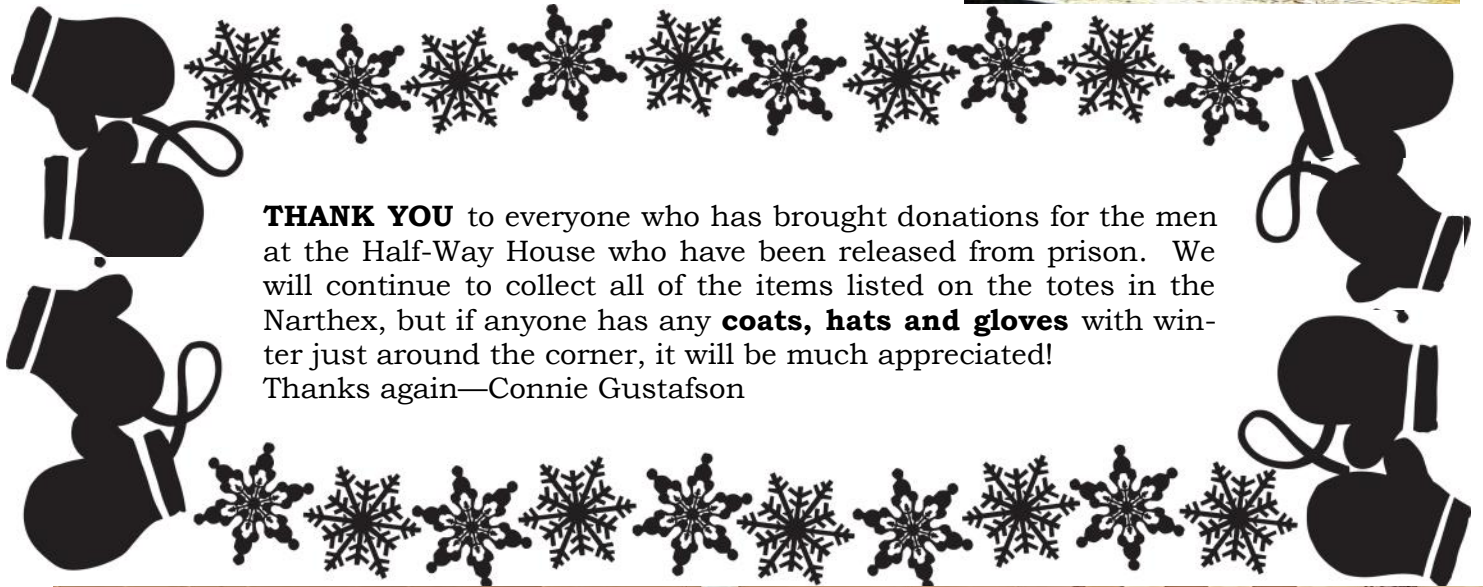
Reminder from Grace Foundation Board

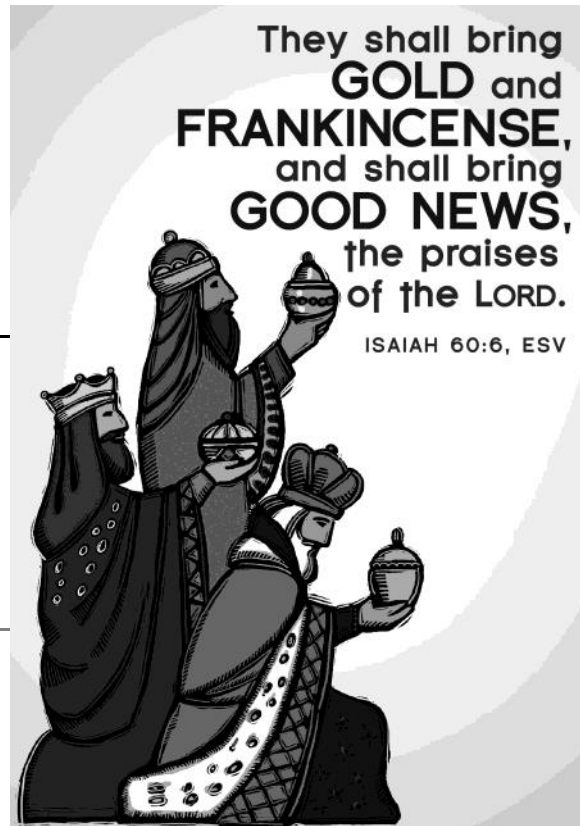
