Everywhere I go I can see I'm not the only one Moving to Jesus


Several years ago I played this song at a presentation for our congregation after a mission trip to Juarez, Mexico. I played it, because I think people assumed we were bringing Jesus to these poor impoverished Mexican people. What we found is that Jesus was already very active in that community. In fact, it seemed like the Holy Spirit was more active there than it was in our affluent American church. Spiritually speaking, it seemed they had much more to offer us than we had to offer them.

Lent is a time of opening ourselves up to the possibility of being altered by God. We often focus on change coming from within, but more often than not it is something outside of ourselves that changes us. It is, as Martin Luther puts it in his explanation of the 3rd Article of the Apostle's Creed: "I believe that I cannot by my own understanding or effort believe in the Lord Jesus or come to him." The Holy Spirit is the source of that change. And the Holy Spirit is far beyond our control. In fact, often we find ourselves catching up to where the Holy Spirit is already at work rather than somehow initiating something new.

During Lent we will be looking at some stories in the book of Acts and how the message of Jesus altered many people. Interaction with the Spirit and fellow followers surprised, inspired and altered all those involved and continues to do so with us today. The word "altered" is used intentionally because it sounds like "altared." This is a time to approach the "altar" as we go through this season of reflection, prayer, self-denial and generosity.

As we worship together my prayer is that you will be inspired (notice the word "spirit" - in-spired). We will be using my friend Richard Bruxvoort Colligan's Lenten liturgy called "Hidden with Christ." As you think about ways you plan on focusing more on God this Lent it is my hope that part of your discipline includes reading through the book of Acts with your eyes open to the ways God created and altered the early church and what that might mean for us. As usual, we will have a light meal before worship and that time of eating together is such a wonderful time to be a community of Christ.

God loves you and so do I, Pastor Dan



GUIDELINES FOR GRACE ACTIVITIES IN INCLEMENT WEATHER

Mitten Tree



A note from the MobilePack Community that Pastor Wayne Pfannkuch is a major part of:

Dear MobilePack Friends,

Here is a final update on the Fort Dodge Mobile Pack that was held on December 2, 2023, at Community Christian School. Thanks to your leadership efforts and the efforts of many others, we packed 108,864 meals, enough to feed 298 children for one year. Most of the food we packed went to Romania, and we don't yet know where the rest will go. We had roughly 500 volunteers and we raised



\$35,251 which was just under our goal of \$36,000. This enables us to pay for the cost of the food that we packed (\$32,000) and give the surplus money to four local ministries: Beacon of Hope, The Lord's Cupboard, Lotus Community Project, and Salvation Army. They will each receive \$812.78. We raise money for local ministries to go along with the worldwide impact of FMSC to provide an additional reason for local people to get involved and give. We distribute all the money that we raise each year and don't carry any of it over to the next year.

The people who packed came from many churches, businesses, organizations, and families. This was truly a community event! We believe that we are not only providing food for children and local friends, but we are carrying on Jesus' work of compassion as well. " And the King will answer them, 'Truly I say to you, to the extent that you did it for one of the least of these brothers or sisters of mine, you did it for Me." (Matthew 25:40)
